MEETING CALLED TO ORDER: Mayor Harris called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Councilmember Dahl led the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING 1:

- (0:00:30) Vigilante West Subdivision Application & Resolution of Intent to Consider Annexation – The public notice, staff report, and draft resolution were included in the council packet. Zoning Officer Fadness discussed the staff report and recommended conditional approval of the subdivision application and resolution of intent to annex. This was an information-only item.
- 2. Vigilante West Subdivision Application & Resolution of Intent to Consider Annexation – Mayor Harris called for public comment. (0:10:20) Dave Jensen commented neither in favor nor against the proposed annexation. Mr. Jensen provided a written version of his comments for the public record.
- 3. Vigilante West Subdivision Application & Resolution of Intent to Consider Annexation – Council discussed the dead-end of Lizzy Street and cash-in-lieu of parkland. (0:17:25) Administration – Clerk/Treasurer Amy Thorngren reported that payments had been coming in through the Doxo app; there had been many dog and business license renewals; and subdivision application fees had been received from Habitat for Humanity for the Rose Hills Subdivision.

(0:18:50) Police Department – Police Chief Mike Sanders reported that there had been 488 calls-for-service in December and discussed the increase in calls over the last several years. He noted that Patrol Officer Zach Butler would be attending the Montana Law Enforcement Academy in January.

(0:21:05) Public Works – A written report was included in the council packet. Public Works Director Kevin Ore reported that he attended a meeting about the proposed upper pressure zone; met with the school district regarding the training of lifeguards; lead and copper samples tested well; and that the school district had offered to give the city a scoreboard for the gym.

Volunteer Fire Department - Fire Chief Roger Campbell was excused.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

 (0:23:15) East Clark Street Sewer District Interlocal Agreement – The draft reinstatement agreement was on the council room table. City Attorney Elverum discussed the agreement. (0:26:30) Dave Jensen commented that the public could not comment because the draft agreement was not distributed before the meeting. (0:26:55) Bob Murdo commented in favor of reinstating the interlocal agreement. City Attorney Elverum answered questions from Council. Councilmember Feist made a motion to table in order to allow more time for the public to review the draft reinstatement agreement. Councilmember Dahl seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

- (0:36:20) Christmas Convoy Update A video of the convoy was shown onscreen. Event organizer Laura Mozer reported on how the first East Helena Christmas Convoy had gone and discussed plans for next Christmas. Council expressed their appreciation of the convoy. The item died for lack of motion. Ms. Mozer agreed to come back in June to request a specific date for the 2025 Christmas Convoy.
- 2. (0:46:15) Personnel Policy Manual Update to Section 03-4 Holidays The draft revision was in the council packet. Mayor Harris noted that the update provided for one floating holiday per year rather than alternating Election Days. (0:47:15) Dave Jensen commented in opposition to the update. Dave Jensen provided written comments in opposition to the update. Councilmember Feist made a motion to approve the update. Councilmember Ferguson seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- 3. (0:47:50) New Town Pump Deviation from Garbage Ordinance Mayor Harris explained that the new Town Pump required a garbage compactor for which the city cannot provide service, but Tri County Disposal can. (0:50:35) Dave Jensen requested clarification on the item and commented in opposition to the proposed deviation. Mr. Jensen provided a written version of his comments including a picture for the public record. Council discussed an administrative fee. Councilmember Dahl made a motion to table the item until the monthly tonnage could be established. Councilmember Feist seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- 4. (0:57:45) Star of David Window Agreement The draft agreement was on the council room table. Mayor Harris noted that it allowed for the Montana Jewish Project to display one of the city's restored Star of David windows at Temple Emanu-El. City Attorney Elverum discussed the details of the agreement. There was no public comment. Councilmember Feist made a motion to approve the agreement. Councilmember Dahl seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

REINSTATEMENT OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR SHARING OF MUNICIPAL WASTEWATER TREATMENT SERVICES BETWEEN CITY OF EAST HELENA AND EAST CLARK STREET COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT

RECITALS

WHEREAS, this Reinstatement Agreement is between the City of East Helena, Montana (the "City") and the East Clark Street County Water and Sewer District of Lewis and Clark County, Montana (the "District"); and

WHERAS, the City and the District entered into an Interlocal Agreement dated March 7, 2017 (the "Original Interlocal Agreement" or "Original ILA") wherein the City agreed, pursuant to the terms of the Original ILA, to accept and treat the District's wastewater system sewage effluent; and

WHEREAS, the District completed construction of its wastewater collection system and began utilizing the City's wastewater treatment plant services in 2017; and

WHEREAS. On April 23, 2024, the City sent written notice to the District of the City's intention to terminate the Original ILA for failure of the District to pay the City the monthly usage charge and the City provided notice of a May 7, 2024 public hearing on the matter; and

WHEREAS, the City held the public hearing on May 7, 2024, with one member of the District's board present, and the City Council unanimously voted to terminate the Original ILA pursuant to Section 13.2.2 thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney, on May 16, 2024, sent a letter to the District of the City's action terminating the Original ILA and indicating that if the District paid the outstanding balance of \$22,298.43 by June 15, 2024, and continued to make timely payments of the District's monthly sewer use charge, then the City was open to entering into negotiations for a new interlocal agreement with the District; and

WHEREAS, the District, prior to June 15, 2024, paid the outstanding balance of the City's sewer use charges; and

WHEREAS, in late May and early June of 2024, various property owners in the District inspected and performed maintenance or correction of water systems that may have been contributing to increased sewage flow in the District and in June and July usage reports showed that the sewage flow decreased by about 40% during these summer months; and

WHEREAS, in late June of 2024, the District had two new board members appointed by the Lewis and Clark County Commission, which now provides the District with a complete board; and

WHEREAS, the District is taking steps to have its bookkeeping and billing handled by a person that is qualified for such tasks and that does not live in the District; and

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WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Attorney have met with the President of the District Board and a representative of the District's bondholder to negotiate a reinstatement of the Original ILA; and

WHEREAS, the City Attorney and the representative of the District's bondholder recommend that the City and the District reinstate the Original ILA with all is provisions, including Exhibits A-E; and

WHEREAS, an adjustment to the District's Monthly Usage Rate form the Original ILA is necessary due to the City increasing the sewer rate for all users of the City's wastewater collection system but was unable to increase the District's Monthly Usage Rate in accordance with Section 11 of the Original ILA; and

WHEREAS, the City and the District intend that this Reinstatement Agreement shall be presented and voted upon at a properly noticed public meeting and approved by a majority of the City Council and a majority of the District Board in order to reinstate the Original ILA; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of East Helena and the Board of Directors of the East Clark Street County Water and Sewer District that, for the reasons stated in the above recitals and pursuant to MCA §7-11-104, the City and District agree it is to their mutual advantage to enter into this Reinstatement Agreement as follows:

1. Original Interlocal Agreement Reinstated. The Original Interlocal Agreement, signed by the District on January 25, 2017, and by the City on March 3, 2017, is reinstated. The Original Interlocal Agreement includes all of the Exhibits A-E and is attached hereto in its entirety.

2. Notice of Termination Rescinded. The City's notice terminating the Original Interlocal Agreement dated May 16, 2024 is rescinded.

3. Monthly Usage Charge. As the City's sewer rates were increased during the revocation period, and are set to increase each year until 2028, the District's Monthly Usage Charge is amended, in compliance with Section 11 of the Original ILA, as follows:

Year	Rate – per gallon of wastewater flow	Penalty Charge – per gallon of wastewater flow above the Reserved Capacity
2025	\$0.01303	\$0.01954
2026	\$0.01330	\$0.01995
2027	\$0.01358	\$0.02036
2028	\$0.01385	\$0.02077

The 2025 Monthly Usage Charge rates adopted above will be charged on the monthly billing the month following the passage of this reinstatement agreement.

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4. Reserved Capacity. The reserved capacity of 24,000 gallons per day, as set forth in Section 8 of the Original ILA, shall be utilized to serve the 107 sewer connections and existing service lines which were installed during the initial construction of the district's wastewater collection system in 2017 (see Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof). The initial 107 approved connections and service lines, as shown on Exhibit A, shall not be subject to the City's system development fee as they were connected to the main or approved prior to the adoption of the fee and because the City had previously allocated capacity within the wastewater collection system based upon the district's existing service lines and connections.

5. Five-year Period of Presumed Approval of New Hook-up Ended. The 5 year period of presumed approval for new hook-ups within the District (referenced in Section 12.0 of the Original ILA) expired on 8 March 2022 and is not started anew with this Reinstatement Agreement. Any previous approvals for additional connections within the district obtained prior to the termination of the Original ILA on May 7, 2024, have been revoked. Under Section 12.0 of the Original ILA the District may request in writing additional connections to the system beyond the initially approved 107 which were installed in 2017. Approval of any request for additional connections is at the City Council's complete discretion, would be subject to the City's system development fees, and would require additional capacity to be allocated by the City.

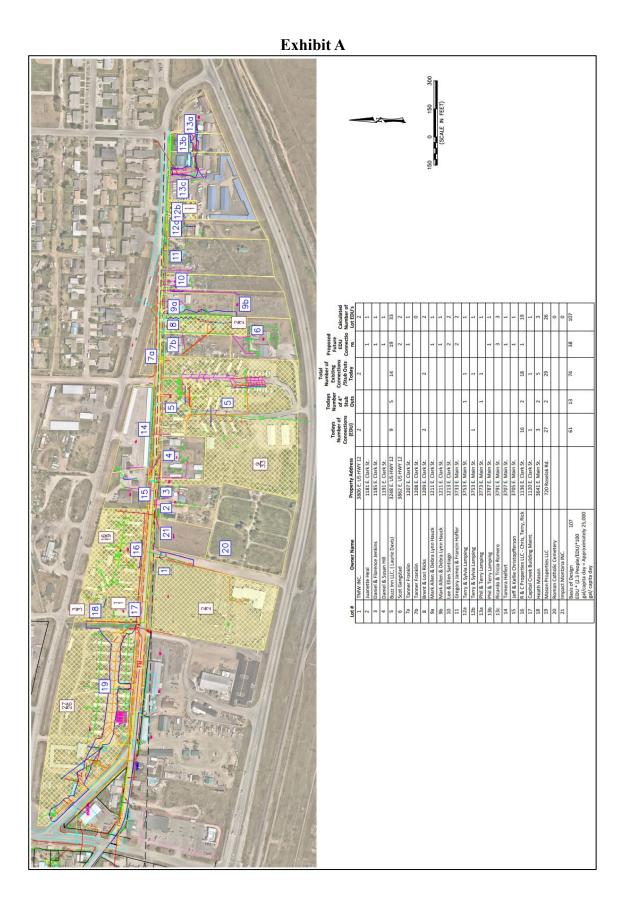

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF EAST HELENA, MONTANA, AMENDING THE EAST HELENA LAND USE MAP BY PREZONING TO RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT ON LOTS LEGALLY DESCRIBED AS LOT 1A, OF THE AMENDED PLAT OF LOT 1 BLOCK B OF THE VIGILANTE MAJOR SUBDIVISION PHASE II LOCATED IN THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 24, TOWNSHIP 10 NORTH, RANGE 3 WEST, P.M.M., LEWIS AND CLARK COUNTY, MONTANA, AS SHOWN ON AMENDED PLAT FILED UNDER DOCUMENT NUMBER 3406028, PRIOR TO ANNEXATION INTO THE CITY OF EAST HELENA, MONTANA

WHEREAS, Vigilante Developers, LLC, the owner of the following-described property, has requested that the City of East Helena pass an ordinance, pursuant to East Helena Zoning Ordinance, for:

A prezoning designation of Residential District for Lot 1A, of the Amended Plat of Lot 1 Block B of the Vigilante Major Subdivision Phase II located in the SE1/4 of Section 24, Township 10 North, Range 3 West, P.M.M., Lewis and Clark County, Montana, as shown on Amended Plat filed under Document Number 3406028, which property is generally located north of Plant Road and west of Vigilante Subdivision.; and

WHEREAS, the City of East Helena adopted the Zoning Ordinance on March 15, 2022 and it became effective on April 13, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Zone Map Amendment has been properly submitted, reviewed, and noticed, in accordance with the procedures set forth in Chapter 12 of the Zoning Ordinance for the City of East Helena Montana and Title 76-2-301, MCA; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Commission held a public hearing on December 19, 2024, to receive and review all written and oral testimony on the zone map amendment;

WHEREAS, the Zoning Commission found that the proposed zone map amendment is consistent with the intent and purpose of the Zoning Ordinance and the East Helena Growth Policy;

WHEREAS, the Zoning Commission has reviewed and considered the nine zone change criteria established in Section 76-2-304, MCA, and found the zone map amendment to be in compliance with the nine criteria; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Commission made a recommendation to the City Council to approve the zone map amendment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing on January 7, 2025, to receive and review all written and oral testimony on the zone map amendment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council found that the proposed zone map amendment is consistent with the intent and purpose of Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed and considered the nine zone change criteria established in Section 76-2-304, MCA, and found the zone map amendment to be in compliance with the nine criteria; and

WHEREAS, the City Council found that the zone map amendment would be in compliance with the City of East Helena Growth Policy and would be in the public interest; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of East Helena, Montana, that:

Section 1

That the above described property is hereby granted a prezoning designation of Residential District for Lot 1A, of the Amended Plat of Lot 1 Block B of the Vigilante Major Subdivision Phase II located in the SE1/4 of Section 24, Township 10 North, Range 3 West, P.M.M., Lewis and Clark County, Montana, as shown on Amended Plat filed under Document Number 3406028, which property is generally located north of Plant Road and west of Vigilante Subdivision.

Section 2

The effective date is thirty days after final adoption of this ordinance on second reading. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on February 19, 2025.
