Montana Foster Closet would like to present a short 10-15 minute PowerPoint presentation highlighting the Non-Profit work they do in the state of Montana. Headquartered in East Helena and Helena, MT MFC provides First Night Bags to children the day they enter foster care. These bags are carefully curated with essentials and comfort items in an effort to reduce the acute trauma of removal and to show the child in that moment that their community sees them and values them.

Montana Foster Closet also maintains two "closets" at the state DPHHS building in Helena which are full of brand new clothes, shoes, coats, baby essentials and more. This location gives CPS workers the chance to take children going through centralized intake on a "shopping trip" for shoes and clothes in the hopes it boosts their confidence in the days ahead.

**(0:00:37) EAST HELENA SUPERFUND UPDATE:** Bridget Williams with the EPA gave an update on East Helena soil remediation. They are still waiting on award of a contractor, hoping to have a contract awarded by St. Patrick's Day. She hopes to have shovels in the ground starting around June of this year. Also, Jess Smith and Bridget Williams will start to do more door-to-door community outreach.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

**(0:05:07)** Dave Jensen commented on Rose Hills proposed bonds, future SIDS and City of East Helena long term debt. Mr. Jensen provided a written version of his comments for the record.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

**(0:10:03) Police Department** – Police Chief Ed Royce reported that there had been 416 calls-for-service in the last month. Approximately half those calls were traffic related. Chief noted that calls are continuing to steadily increase. Chief reported that the Dept. of Public Health delivered a new round of Narcan and hard-sided gun cases. These cases are free to the public. Chief reported that East Helena is working with Highway Patrol and will start to investigate traffic accidents on Highway 12 and Highway 518 within the East Helena City Limits.

**(0:20:31) Public Works** – a written report was included in the council packet. Public Works Director Kevin Ore reminded Council that public meeting dates for sewer plant construction phases and related rates are set for March 9<sup>th</sup> , 10am-11am, and March 10<sup>th</sup> , 6pm-7pm at the City Hall gym. MMIA is processing an insurance claim for Main Street Park tree damage. They will cover clean up and replacement cost of trees. Kevin also reported he is still working with Federal Highways on getting a signed grant agreement in place for Valley Drive.

**(0:22:56) Volunteer Fire Department** – Chief Campbell reported they received 14 calls last month, 10 of those were medical calls, and 1 chimney fire. Chief talked about finishing up his ISO inspection. The review is scheduled for March 20<sup>th</sup>.

## **1.) WWTP Report**

- Shane and I submitted our response to DEQ for our wastewater plant inspection.

- We will be having to send the sewer camera in for repairs, not holding gas pressure internally. Looking at pricing for second camera to have as a backup. (Discuss)
- Crews were able to find and raise a couple buried/missing manholes in the collection system.
- Clarifier is continuing to improve on water quality, thanks to Shane for continued hard work at the wastewater plant.

## **2.) Metal Removal Building**

- Shane has been working on some chemical dosing issues at the metals plant. Determined the dosing errors was caused by a bad pump.

- Crews have to reinstall the aerator at M.C. Creek tank.

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## **City of East Helena and East Helena Valley Rodeo Association**

### ***Proposal Narrative***

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#### **Give a brief description of the organization's history and mission.**

The City of East Helena is an incorporated town that owns the property that has been leased to the East Helena Valley Rodeo Association (EHVRA). The story of the City of East Helena is framed around the more than 100 years of the Asarco Lead Smelter. The smelter was the backbone of the City for over 100 years and created a culture of people that were strong and hard workers. The City is on a mission to rebuild a town devastated by lead, a poison that can affect children's growth, to be a strong viable community. This mission aligns closely with the Treacy Foundation in that this request seeks to rebuild East Helena with affordable homes, business opportunities and City attractions associated with the tradition of a highly regarded event, the East Helena rodeo.

The proud people of East Helena established themselves as a close knit community that stood by each other as if they all were family. This same quality of proud team members is seen in the East Helena Valley Rodeo Association (EHVRA).

The EHVRA just celebrated their 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary in July of 2024. This annual rodeo is one of the largest Northern Rodeo Association (NRA) rodeos in Montana due to the quality of contestants and the number of spectators. The rodeo in July is a huge event, attracting more than 5,000 spectators for the 3 day event. Last year, once again, the rodeo was sold out both Friday and Saturday to standing room only crowds. Unfortunately hundreds of spectators were turned away due to concerns for the safety of overcrowding the standing room only areas as every seat in the house was filled.

The City wants to continue support of East Helena Valley Rodeo Association to put on the high-quality rodeo it has for over 60 years and look to the future for the next 60 years! To this end EHVRA signed a lease for 60 years in 2023 with the COEH. The partnership's vision includes reconstructing a quality rodeo arena that is safe and attractive so that the community of East Helena and our neighbors can continue to attract quality competitors and the thousands of rodeo fans in our state and the western US.

#### **What are the goals and objectives of the project for which you are requesting funds?**

The new rodeo grounds broke ground on Thursday, December 14, 2023 to turn a farmers field into a semi level area for the rodeo arena and a 1,200 spot parking lot. The plan to support the needs for food and bathroom facilities will be accomplished with food trucks and port-a-potties for the immediate future, awaiting city water infrastructure. Shelters and Conex containers that are temporary will serve the other functions temporarily until additional funding can be secured in later phases.

EHVRA has successfully secured funding for the new arena, parking lot, and the first phase of the grandstands. This project is to secure the second phase of grandstands, capping off the original effort to launch the rodeo in its new location.

### **Give current status of the project.**

The Phase I grandstands have been ordered and are set to arrive in April 2026. The cost was \$200,000. Phase II grandstands have been identified and will be ordered once funding is secured.

### **Describe what changes will occur as a result of this project being funded and what this will mean to the future of your organization.**

This request is for grandstands that are ADA accessible and seat as many as 624 persons. These grandstands will make a difference in ticket sales and safety for the spectators coming to our community and bringing their retail business purchases. The grandstands are essential to making the rodeo grounds fully usable and accessible for community events ranging from the current NRA rodeo, to many other events including barrel racing, roping events, concerts and other civic gatherings. At present, the site lacks ADA-compliant seating, limiting use beyond the annual rodeo. Temporary bleachers are rented only for rodeoweek, making other events inaccessible due to the lack of appropriate seating. The EHVRA has done extensive fundraising to secure the first half of two phases to ensure all seating meets ADA, safety, and building code requirements.

The current 3-day rodeo has been independently financially solvent for over 60 years, and it is our goal to continue and expand on this tradition.

Additionally this new venue will allow the City to be able to host other community events that support the local economy and support citizen activities in their own community. The arena, though built to specifically host the EHVRA rodeo, can be used to sponsor other roping, barrel racing and rough stock events as well as concerts and High School FFA and 4H events, all of which need grandstand seating. These additional events will generate revenue that can be directed to high need projects such as including an additional 1,700 lateral seats, covering grandstands, adding sky boxes, and an event center. As a 501(c)3, EHVRA reinvests funds in rodeo advancement and supporting the East Helena community.

### **Will this project generate its own revenue?**

The nonprofit EHVRA does generate its own ongoing revenue through ticket sales and advertising. This revenue hopefully will expand with growing events and the addition of flushing bathrooms, a concession stand, ticket office, exhibit barn, skyboxes, more grandstands and other spectator improvements. Once additional revenue and funding is secured, there are plans to build an event center that could host 4H and Future Farmers of America exhibits and a barn for school kids to participate in projects that will be sheltered from the weather. As previously stated, the EHVRA has been self funded and progressive over the last 60 years!

To date, EHVRA has raised close to \$1 million to secure the land and move the rodeo to its new location through County and City supported ARPA funds, private donations, and partnerships with various granting funders.

Fundraising for the EHVRA is conducted year-round through a variety of community events, including East Helena Food Truck events, the Annual Christmas Stroll, Murdoch's parking lot activities, EH Eagles 4040 Steak Dinners, local VFW parades and events, Bingo nights at Missouri River Brewery, and regular attendance at East Helena City Council meetings. In addition, the EHVRA continues to pursue both local and national sponsorships to support rodeo and community programming. Current sponsorship applications are underway with American Chemet, Town Pump, Ash Grove/Helena Sand and Gravel, and Valley Bank to support the grandstand project and other ongoing improvements.

Available funds currently total several thousand dollars and have been allocated toward the purchase and initial construction of a new 20-row grandstand, which will provide greater seating capacity than any previous EHVRA structure. To complete Phase II of the project, the EHVRA is actively seeking grants and sponsorships totaling \$197,000 to construct ADA-compliant seating for approximately 1,350 spectators. Support has been requested from the Treacy Foundation, Valley Bank, Ash Grove/Helena Sand and Gravel, Town Pump, and American Chemet. Glacier Bank has also expressed strong interest in providing support beyond its previous contributions. While loans are not an ideal funding mechanism for a nonprofit organization, all financing options are being carefully explored. An external fundraising firm has been engaged to assist with sponsorship development and overall fundraising efforts.

**Have you applied to us before or received funding from us? If so, please provide date and amount of funding received.**

In February 2024 the City of East Helena collaborated with EHVRA to submit an application to the Treacy Foundation to fund the continued development of the EHVRA leased property owned by COEH. That grant was successful and those funds, \$10,000, were recently used to pay \$200,000 for Phase I's 624 seat grandstands, including shipping and installation.
